In 2011 celebrate the...

... 85th anniversary of Aline Barnsdall's gift of Hollyhock House and eight acres of Olive Hill to the City of Los Angeles.

... 84th anniversary of the City of Los Angeles officially accepting eight acres, dedicating Barnsdall Park and accepting an additional two acres and Residence A (Barnsdall Art Center) as a gift from Aline Barnsdall.

... 84th anniversary of Barnsdall Park being opened to the public.

... 48th anniversary of Hollyhock House being declared a City of Los Angeles Landmark.

... 46th anniversary of Barnsdall Park and Residence A (Barnsdall Art Center) being declared City of Los Angeles Landmarks.

... 44th anniversary of the opening of the Junior Arts Center.

... 40th anniversary of the opening of the Los Angeles Municipal Art Gallery.

... 40th anniversary of Barnsdall Park - the entire site including Hollyhock House and Residence A (Barnsdall Art Center) - being placed on the National Register of Historic Places.

... 4th anniversary of the designation of the Aline Barnsdall Complex - the land, approximately 11 acres given to the City of Los Angeles by Aline Barnsdall in 1927 - as a National Historic Landmark. The gift also included four structures now considered to have historic significance: Hollyhock House, Residence A (Barnsdall Art Center), Schindler's Terrace, and the Spring House. These structures and the land comprise the National Historic Landmark designation.

Barnsdall Park

Located at the crest of Olive Hill overlooking the City of Los Angeles, Barnsdall Park had its beginning in the early 1900's when Aline Barnsdall came west from Chicago with plans to develop a theatre company. She purchased 36 acres on Olive Hill, property known for its landscape of olive trees. In 1927 she donated approximately 11 acres to the City of Los Angeles. Aline Barnsdall had plans to develop a performing arts complex; the focal point being a theatre for the production of avant-garde plays. Plans were also in place for apartments for artists and actors, a playhouse for children, and a home for her family. She selected Frank Lloyd Wright to design the buildings. The first one was Hollyhock House, her home. The hollyhock was Barnsdall's favorite flower and it was at her request that Frank Lloyd Wright incorporated an abstracted design based on the plant in the architectural scheme.

When Aline Barnsdall donated the land and its Frank Lloyd Wright designed structures to the City of Los Angeles she wanted to provide an accessible arts center, incorporating and preserving the famous Hollyhock House as a vital component. Barnsdall desired to establish and maintain an active arts center to celebrate the cultural diversity of the immediate community and the entire City of Los Angeles.

Aline Barnsdall's gift to the City of Los Angeles reflected her passion for the arts and led to the creation of the Municipal Arts Department, today known as the Department of Cultural Affairs. With the birth of the Department of Cultural Affairs in 1980, programs and exhibits became a part of its mission, programs that are used by thousands of Los Angeles community members as well as visitors from throughout the world. Programs include the adult and youth art classes at the Barnsdall Art Center and the Junior Arts Center; exhibitions at the Los Angeles Municipal Art Gallery, Junior Arts Center Gallery and Hollyhock House; museum education and tours program at the Los Angeles Municipal Art Gallery, Junior Arts Center Gallery and Hollyhock House; theatre programs events at the Gallery Theatre; and, numerous festivals and special events during the year that celebrate the cultural diversity of the community and the entire City of Los Angeles.

About the City of Los Angeles Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA)

The Department of Cultural Affairs generates and supports high quality arts and cultural experiences for Los Angeles' 4 million residents and 25 million annual visitors. DCA advances the social and economic impact of the arts and assures access to arts and cultural experiences through grant making, marketing, public art, community arts programming, arts education, and partnerships with artists and arts and cultural organizations in neighborhoods throughout the City of Los Angeles.

DCA's operating budget and managed portfolio totaled \$36.7 million in fiscal year 2009/10. It consisted of: \$9.6 million in Transient Occupancy Tax funds; \$12.2 million in funds from the Public Works Improvement Arts Program; \$8.6 million from the Private Arts Development Fee Program; \$4.9 million in City related and indirect cost allocations; and \$1.4 million in private and public funds raised during the year. DCA grants approximately \$3 million annually to over 280 artists and nonprofit arts organizations through its long-established Grants Administration Division. DCA provides arts and cultural programming in its numerous neighborhood arts and cultural centers, theaters, and historic sites, and manages several arts and education programs.

The Department also administers the City's Private Arts Development Fee and Public Works Improvements Arts Programs, a portfolio of approximately \$20.8 million in fiscal year 2009/10. In addition, DCA raises outside public and private funds, over \$10.5 million since fiscal year 2007/08, used to re-grant to LA-based arts and cultural organizations for special grant initiatives and to support DCA's special programming and facilities. DCA markets the City's cultural events through development and collaboration with strategic partners, design and production of creative promotional materials, and management of the culturela.org website visited by over 2.7 million people annually.
